

Pick's Drive-In

Pick's Drive-in has been a Cloverdale landmark since it was built in 1923 at the height of Prohibition. The building was originally a Reed and Bell's Root Beer stand. Until 1945 when the franchise agreement expired, Reed and Powell was a franchise of A&W Root Beer.

Sometime during the 40's, the business was purchased by Lynmarie Hoyer's grandparents, Mayo and Johnnie Mae Pickard, who had operated a café at the Greyhound Bus Terminal in Santa Rosa.

The Pickards moved to Cloverdale, changed the name of the root beer stand to Pick's, and started selling hamburgers made with the same secret relish recipe that had made them so successful in Santa Rosa.

Claudia Clow purchased Pick's, building and all, around 1990 and was very "hands on" in the business until she sold it in 2016 to current owners, David and Debby Alioto, who also own Healdsburger in Healdsburg.

This past March, a new Cloverdale homeowner by the name of Justin Beth rescued a vintage Pick's sign that Claudia had offered for free on Facebook Marketplace. The sign, which was believed to have blown over in a wind storm, was bolted to a large metal frame with square headed bolts on the restaurant's rooftop. An electrician by trade, Justin's plan was to clean it up, leaving the patina, restore the electrical internals and hang it up.

For many Cloverdalians, their first job was behind the counter at Pick's. Birthdays and first dates have been celebrated there. It's often a "must stop" location for travelers passing through town. A few years ago, the daughter of a couple who met and courted at Pick's, brought them back for their 50th wedding anniversary.

As long as folks crave a great burger and a touch of nostalgia, Pick's is destined to remain a popular gathering spot for locals and tourists alike for many years to come.



Cloverdale Senior Multipurpose Center June is Elder Abuse Awareness Month

Abuse. So many thoughts come in my mind when I hear this word. First I think of mistreatment in some form, emotionally, physically, financially and more. When this word is applied to a situation that a senior 65 years and older is involved in, it is heartbreaking on so many levels. Under California law, elder abuse can be both criminal and civil. Elder abuse can be neglect; this is a caregiver's failure to provide assistance with basic needs such as cleanliness, healthy meals, shelter and keeping an elder safe. Abandonment of an elder who cannot properly take care of himself or herself, by a caregiver is another form of abuse as is isolation, and/or abduction. A caregiver can be family members, spouses, as well as paid staff. Some abuse can stem from a caregiver who just cannot handle the pressure and stress of taking care of someone who is frail and cannot help themselves. Last year in 2020 there were 111 reported cases of elder abuse in Cloverdale, remember what is reported is usually about a fifth of actual cases.

It is our responsibility to report elder abuse in its many forms. What can we do as a community to help support caregivers before they are so stressed that they do something they may regret? Here are some ideas; offer to sit with the elder so their caregiver can take a break, call and check in with the senior and caregiver, offer to run errands, or make a meal and deliver it to their home. I treasure the time we have with our elders and know we must keep them safe.

Let's Travel

Malta, a stunning island nation in the Mediterranean Sea, will pay you to visit this year. Opening June 1 to tourism, Malta's travel incentives will offer vouchers for both hotels and diving excursions. If you're interested in getting paid to stay in a hotel or dive off the coast of Malta, this might be for you. Travelers need a negative COVID-19 PCR test as of now, but it is expected that evidence of full vaccination will be sufficient in the near future. You can find up-to-date information on Malta's Tourism Authority website, https://www.mta.com.mt/en/home

You can get a voucher for up to 100 Euros (\$120) per person for a hotel. The amount you're eligible for will depend on the star-rating of the hotel and you must stay at least three nights to qualify for the incentive.

In May, the U.S. Senate approved the Alaska Tourism Recovery Act that would permit large cruise ships to operate cruises to Alaska this summer. The measure goes to the U.S. House for approval before it can be sent to President Joe Biden for his signature. The purpose of the effort was to circumvent the Canadian decision to close its ports to large cruise ships until 2022. Under the U.S. Passenger Vessel Services Act, all foreign flag passenger ships are required to stop at a foreign port when transporting American citizens between two U.S. ports. The large cruise ships traditionally have sailed either from the port of Vancouver, Canada, or Seattle, Washington on their summer cruise programs to Alaska. The closure of the Canadian ports was effectively blocking the cruise lines from Alaska this year.

The Creative Corner Christy Latchford

Here in Cloverdale we are used to the heat when it starts to dominate our summer days. But, not all of us have been through tough droughts before and this summer promises sadly to be a doozy. So for those of us who have house plants, gardens, etc...a sense of panic can set in when we are told we will be expected to cut back 20-25% on our water usage.

No need to panic my plant loving friends! There are many simple ways we can save and repurpose our water that does not involve pickle barrels or heavy things to lift. They just involve utilizing a few strategically located containers and a willingness to adapt. My creative recommendations? A 5 gallon bucket for each shower(ACE sells them) and also a large container that can fit in your kitchen sink.

These two I am recommending as most can relate to having to let water run until it gets warm and having a vessel near each to catch the colder water can then be used for those cherished plant babies. Will you need to carry a heavy bucket? Heck no! The premise here is simply to catch water free of soaps and chemicals. Once in the bucket you can dip a smaller watering can, a ball jar, a plastic cup or whatever you have that can be dipped in and then carried to plants in need of a drink.

I challenge all to give it a try as you might find you are quite surprised at how much water is usually lost down the drain and how with a little adaptation we can not only help our plants survive this drought, but cut down on our water bills as well.





Prebiotics and Probiotics – A Dynamic DuoGina Berry, MS, RD, CLT

Last month we learned about probiotics, beneficial bacteria that live in our GI tracts. Probiotics need food to stay healthy so they can do their jobs. This food is called prebiotics! This term was not coined until 1995 and this relatively new concept is being studied as a way to manipulate the health of the good bacteria throughout our body. The most common prebiotics are soluble fibers like fructooligosaccharides, inulin, and galactooligosaccharides. Prebiotics are easy to get in regular everyday meals and snacks. No special food or supplements necessary!

Prebiotics are found in fruits and vegetables such as bananas, apples, onions, leeks, kale, asparagus, and artichokes. They are also in beans and lentils and whole grains such as oats, buckwheat, and corn. Kefir (a fermented dairy beverage) is great because it has both probiotics and prebiotics all in one healthy drink and you only need a couple ounces daily to get thousands of good bacteria.

What happens in Cloverdale when you call 911?

Our town is fortunate to have an ambulance service all to itself. Before you call 911, make sure it's a real medical emergency. If you want to report a threat or a crime, call the police. That phone number is 707-894-2150. If you want to report a fire, call the fire Department at 707-894-3545. Often in emergencies other than medical, people call 911 when they could call the service they need directly, thus keeping the 911 line open for medical emergencies.

What's a medical emergency? When someone is hurt in an accident or attack, when a person is threatened with physical harm, or when someone at home is in need of trained help that you are not able to provide, that's when to call 911.

When you call 911 in Cloverdale, first to arrive on the scene will be the Cloverdale Fire Department. There is a qualified EMT on every shift, ready to answer 911 calls. Soon to follow is the Cloverdale Ambulance, which is staffed with a qualified paramedic and an EMT 24/7. It is housed in downtown Cloverdale, making it readily available to anyone in town. If the Cloverdale Ambulance is out on another call and unavailable, Bell's ambulance will be dispatched from Healdsburg when needed. In either case your person will be transported to the hospital of his or her choice.

Many towns in northern and west Sonoma County share an ambulance service, but here in Cloverdale we are fortunate to have EMTs in both our fire department and our own ambulance service ready to serve the public.

Water is a resource that our community shares, and it is critical that we all protect and conserve this valuable resource.

These are a few of the water-wasting activities that are prohibited year-round in cities in Sonoma and Marin counties.

- Washing sidewalks, walkways, driveways or other hard surfaced areas with a hose. Use a broom instead.
- Irrigation runoff to streets and storm drains from overwatering or sprinkler-overspray of landscapes.
- Using a hose without a self-closing shutoff nozzle to wash cars, boats, or trailers.
- Irrigating outdoors during and within 48 hours following measurable rainfall.
- Using potable water in decorative water features that do not recirculate the water.







Stuffed Cheesy Burgers

Summertime for many of us is backyard BBQ time. These stuffed burgers will add flare to that meal. The cheese combination & stuffing goodies is a personal choice. So be creative & let your imagination go wild.

For two meal sized patties

1 pound ground beef divided into four equal parts
Two white or brown mushrooms diced
1/3 cup cream cheese softened
1/3 cup shredded cheddar cheese
Pinch of salt & pepper

Combine the cheese's & other ingredients in a bowl & mix well.


Form each piece of ground beef into a very thin round patty. They will be very big around. Place half the cheese mixture in the middle & lay the other patty on top & press the outer edges to seal & form into a round patty.

To grill, sear the outside of the patty on direct heat for one to two minutes just enough to brown the outside. Then finish indirect until the center of the patty presses firmly. About 5 to 6 minutes. You can also do these on the stovetop in a pan & finish in the oven on 375 degrees

I serve these open-face on a toasted bun with shredded lettuce & chopped tomatoes.
