
Editor's Note





Stylin' On First Street Michele Armanino

The quartet of barbers at Juan Favela's First Street Barber Shop may not break out in harmony while snipping and styling your hair, but you will certainly feel welcomed and pampered while sitting high in a cushy leather barber chair! Favela purchased the two-chair establishment at 112 E First Street from its previous owner in 2016 and many months later, the remodeled shop boasted six vintage barber chairs, four skilled barbers and an original, red, white and blue striped barber's pole to boot.

"I was born and raised in Cloverdale," Juan said. I love being in tune with the community. It's a wonderful place to raise children, too." Inspired by his Uncle, a barber in Ukiah, Favela attended Moler Barber College in Santa Rosa for nine months where he graduated in 2007, passing the rigorous barber examination.

Favela commented that his shop is unique in that his experienced barbers specialize in a variety of styles at reasonable prices. Favela's customers range in age from six months to one hundred and two years old! When asked what methods he might use when cutting the hair of small children who are sometimes afraid of the barber shop, he chuckled and said, "Lots of lollipops!"

Favela, a fifteen-year veteran barber, conducts his individual consultations slowly, always listening carefully to his customers' requests and assuring them of a flattering haircut. Local kids come into the barber shop with pictures of celebrities and ask Juan to do his magic. "I can usually copy a style from a picture fairly easily." Juan commented. Favela gives some credit for his shop's precision haircuts to modern-day styling tools. "One hundred years ago," Juan explained, "clippers had to be squeezed manually. Today's clippers are electric and cordless."

As customers settle into Juan's comfy barber chair for a buzz cut, gentlemen's cut, scissor or short fade cut, they look forward to chatting with him, sometimes even asking for advice. "I learn from my customers, too." Favela said. "If you can't trust your barber, who can you trust?"



City Of Cloverdale Financial Update

March 2022

An annual audit of the City of Cloverdale's Financial Statements is conducted by an Independent Auditor with the appropriate qualifications and background in public accounting. Each major fund maintained by the City is audited according to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), which are uniform minimum standards of and guidelines to financial accounting and reporting. The auditing firm conducting the Annual Audit is Cropper Accountancy Corporation, an accounting firm formed in 1986, primarily to provide audit, accounting and tax services to non-profit organizations and local governmental agencies. This is the second year of a three-year contract with this firm.

All governmental financial transactions and balances are not all accounted for in a single accounting entity. A governmental unit is accounted for through multiple separate funds, each of which is a fiscal and accounting entity with a self-balancing set of accounts. Common Funds maintained by the City include the following:

- General Fund basic activities and services provided by the City. The Cloverdale Police Department is largely funded by the City's General Fund. The largest source of general fund revenue is local property tax revenue and sales tax revenues.
- Special Revenue Funds –Funds like Measure M (road Tax) funds utilized for street maintenance services and activities.
- Enterprise funds The City's Water, Wastewater and Airport are all managed as separate business enterprises and are accounted for in separate funds.
- Non-Major Funds include Gas Tax Revenue and certain grants like Community Development Block Grants and programs including Asset Forfeiture.

The auditor examines the financial statements presented by the City to ensure that the revenues are received and spent in accordance with the laws and regulations, make best practices recommendations to management and present this information to the City Council. Included with the audit is Management's Discussion & Analysis (MD&A), which presents a narrative overview and analysis of the financial activities of the City for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021. Some key highlights in the FY 2020-21 Audit include:

- The City's total net position June 30, 2021 was \$99,699,659, a decrease of \$914,901 over the prior year.
- General fund balance is \$6,203,600, an increase of \$1,121,185 from the prior year's fund balance of \$5,082,415. The fund balance is approximately 82% of total General Fund expenditures.
- Total City revenues, including program and general revenues, were \$17,445,239, an increase of \$125,561 from the prior year
- Total expenses were \$18,360,140, an increase of \$2,225,447 or 13.8% over the prior year.

The Fiscal Year Audit will be presented to City Council on March 9th. Once finalized, the fy 2020-21 Annual Audit is a public document, included in the Council Agenda Packet. A copy of the Audit will be placed on the City's website along with past years audits. The auditing process is overseen by the City's Finance Dept. led by the City's Finance Director Susie Holmes (sholmes@ci.cloverdale.ca.us).

This year, City Staff and the Council are going to consider developing a biennial budget based on two fiscal years, FY 2022-23 and FY 2023-24 rather than a single year budget. Biennial budgeting is expected to enable the City Council to focus on long-term and strategic aspects of budgeting, rather than concentrating on a single year. A biennial budget is a better complement to the city's long-term strategic planning efforts, the five-year Capital Improvement Program and other planning tools, leading to more consistent citywide priorities from year to year.

The first step in the budget process is to review existing budget goals and update them and or develop new budget objectives based on the current goals and priorities set by the City Council. This is established early in the process and is intended to set the spending priorities for the upcoming fiscal year.

The top Budget Themes and Goals Statement for the current fy 2021-22 budget include:

- Economic Recovery (Respond to current COVID-19 emergency) - Pursue federal and state funding for response costs; Continue collaboration on economic development partnerships to assist business community to find creative ways to promote and support local businesses; Work with the County on Regional Economic Recovery Planning.
- Revenue Enhancement Explore and Implement Progressive Strategies to enhance fiscal responsibility and raise municipal revenue (renewal of Utility User Tax) to fund vital public services and projects that enhance Cloverdale's quality of life.
- Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Strengthen public safety and Community Policing and Invest in resiliency strategy and emergency preparedness measures that protect the health, safety and well-being of the citizens and businesses in Cloverdale.
- Housing and Homelessness Address the City's housing needs with a primary focus on measures that increase affordable housing and implement strategies in the homeless strategic plan that address the fundamental causes of homelessness, provide permanent housing options and support services.
- Infrastructure & Technology Invest in the completion of key infrastructure (streets, parks, technology and facilities) and Technology projects to protect and improve property values and maintain Cloverdale's quality of life.
- Planning & Sustainability Fund planning initiatives that attract and expand housing and businesses needed to create jobs and ensure a vibrant local economy while meeting sustainability targets and environmental goals.

As part of the annual budget process, the Council will review the above listed budget goals. Parks & Recreation projects and programs have garnered significant interest by the community and that interest will likely be reflected in the budget goal statements for the next biennial budget. Residents, businesses and stakeholders are encouraged to participate in the budget process to ensure their interests are considered during the budget process.

The City no longer publishes a static copy of the budget and instead utilizes the OpenGov platform, an online budgeting tool to provide transparency, effectively communicate our budget and strategic planning goals to the public and build trust with our citizens. Councilmembers, staff and the public are able to access the City's budget at any time of day in a user-friendly format online on the City's website. Data is updated daily for the most current and accurate information. OpenGov, Inc. user interface offers a cloud-based, simple, and intuitive process to allow for an electronic process of budgeting, submitting applications, permits, or to file code violation concerns.

The city will use every communication medium including the Weekly Cloverdale Newsletter, City Website and social media sites to inform residents about the budget process. Residents are encouraged to present requests for funding for both years of the biennial budget to City Council during the budget preparation season, which takes place in March – June of this year. The current budget schedule is:

- Wednesday, May 4, 2022, 9:00 am COUNCIL BUDGET WORKSHOP
- Wednesday, June 8, 2022, 6:00 pm Council review of draft budget
- Wednesday, June 22, 2022, 6:00 pm
 Council adopt final budget for FY 22-23

Facts From The Past Kay Wells

Do you recall your senior year and graduation from High School? The History Museum keeps copies of The Spectator, the Cloverdale High School yearbook. Here are some excerpts from a 1915 copy.

First a bit of the Cloverdale High School history:

The first graduation ceremony for 5 students was held in June of 1893. (In the early 1900s two young students rode a white bull to class!) The first girls basketball team was formed in 1909, and the first yearbook, The Spectator, was published. The first football team was formed in 1935 (They lost their first game to Ukiah High.) Admission was 35 cents.

The 1915 class was particularly proud of their championship Debating Team, beating Solano, Napa and other Sonoma County teams. They were also proud of their dramatic performances, one of which was performed in Cloverdale's Humbert's Opera House

Here is an excerpt from the school song The Blue and Gold:

With honor ever high in view as students we will work. From Freshman to Senior class our duties ne'er to shirk."

Teachers were not exempt from High School Rules:

"You will not keep company with men.

You may not ride in a carriage or automobile with any man unless related.

You may not dress in bright colors.

You may under no circumstances dye your hair.

You must wear at least two petticoats.

Your dresses must not be any shorter than two inches above the ankle.

AND you must keep your classroom swept daily, scrubbed weekly, and blackboards cleaned daily.

Start the fire at 7 a.m. so the room will be warm by 8 a.m."


Dustin Wallace August 3 1987February 13 2022

There is nothing quite like taking a pleasant stroll and then you look down to see... yuck! A pile of dog doo, or commonly, many piles of dog doo.

Dog waste is a common sight on creeks and trails throughout the Russian River Watershed. Not only is it an eyesore, but it is also a health concern for people and the environment.

Water quality testing in many populated areas of our watershed reveals elevated levels of fecal bacteria in local waterways. Runoff from dog waste is a primary contributor to this. High levels of harmful bacteria can make waters unhealthy for people and pets who recreate in or near the contaminated streams.


Nutrient runoff from the waste washes into waterways and causes algal blooms which may cause aquatic life to suffocate. Algal blooms also turn waters a murky green, and some types of blooms can be harmful to pets and wildlife.

The Russian River is the main source of drinking water and a prized natural resource for over 600,000 people in Sonoma, Mendocino, and Marin Counties. The health of the River is influenced by the health of the creeks feeding into it, and the health of these creeks reflects how we care for the land.

We can prevent this pollution! Please be a good neighbor and community member:

- Carry baggies with you. It's a great idea to carry a few extra bags for your dog and for fellow dog owners who may have forgotten theirs.
- Pick up your dog's waste and throw it in the trash, even if you have to walk a little further to carry it to the nearest trash bin.

President's Volunteer Service Awards







How to Prevent Flight Delays (and What to Do If They Happen Anyway)

Flights can be delayed due to Extreme Weather, Air Traffic Control, Security Concerns, Late Arriving Aircraft, Mechanical and Crew Issues.

You can cope with flight delays by checking on time performance, choosing an early flight, booking a nonstop flight, being proactive at the gate, knowing your rights, checking the weather before you go, and keeping airline apps in your phone. Travel Insurance is also a consideration.

On Time Performance information is available in airline reservations systems and at travel agencies. Proactive at the gate means checking your airline app and Flight Aware (https://flightaware.com/ on your phone. Knowing your Rights can be understood by reviewing the Contract of Carriage for your airline (an easy Google search)

Flying with a Dog? Here's What You Need to Know

Some airlines restrict the total number of pets allowed in cabin on any given flight, and these spots are usually parceled out on a first-come, first-served basis—so you will want to book early. Expect to pay a fee to fly with your dog. Current standard fees range from around \$75 to \$200 each way.

If at all possible, choose a direct flight. Get to the airport early enough to exercise your dog without creating a lot of time pressure. Federal regulations require pets to be at least eight weeks old to fly. If you have a young, senior, or fragile pet, consult with your vet as to whether they are up for the rigors of air travel.

In the very near future, we will be contacting business owners and managers for one-on-one meetings in order to learn about specific impacts to local business and identify solutions," adds Neena Hanchett, Director of the Cloverdale Chamber of Commerce.

Business watch meetings were previously held in January 2020, and February 2021, for business owners and managers to highlight concerns about public safety, graffiti, vandalism, and disadvantaged individuals in and around the plaza.







Cloverdale Arts Alliance's Americana Night





-- are much shorter than ours, so we must inevitably deal with their loss. What can you do to make that difficult time easier for all involved?


In many cases, we must make an end-of-life decision for our pets when their quality of life becomes poor. No one can tell you exactly when that right time is, but your veterinarian can help. Dr. Katie Silva right here at Animal Hospital of Cloverdale provides in-home euthanasia services for those who prefer to not take their pet to the hospital. She and her colleagues have been compassionate to me and my beloved animals over the years. I have also had good experiences at VCA in Santa Rosa when I needed emergency euthanasia over a weekend or holiday.

Losing a pet can be like losing a friend or family member. Self-care is very important at this time. If you feel yourself becoming unwell, reach out for help. Don't let anyone tell you, "It's just a pet," or, "You can get another one."

Lastly, be honest with children about pet loss. I have seen some people lie to children at this time, saying the pet "ran away" or "went to heaven" without really telling what happened. Pets teach children many lessons including commitment, responsibility, compassion, and ultimately letting go and grieving. This is often the first experience of death for children and can help them understand the precious brevity of life.







CERT to train Windsor HS Students **Cloverdale Training Next**

The Northern Sonoma County Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) has been invited to train a group of Windsor High School students to become FEMA certified CERT volunteers.

The in-person, hands-on training will take place at Windsor High School Each student will be sworn in as a California Disaster Service Worker upon completion. Some Cloverdale adults will also join in to complete their training as well.

Northern Sonoma County CERT has previously trained students at Cloverdale High School.

The training consists of learning skills in: First Aid, Search and Rescue, Disaster Triage, Fire Suppression, Victim Evacuation, and working with First Responders.

The next CERT "hands on" basic course will be held during July in Cloverdale. Adults and high school students over age 15 are invited to participate. The training is free, but the equipment issued to each CERT volunteer costs \$75. This fee is waived for students and those who cannot afford it. The training program is offered both in English and Spanish.

Also offered this coming summer in Cloverdale will be advanced training for those who are already CERT qualified volunteers. These trainings include:

- Domestic Pet Assistance during evacuation and sheltering
- Farm Animal Assistance during major incidents, evacuation and sheltering
- Radio Communications for CERTs
- Evacuation Traffic Control for CERTs
- Shelter Management for CERTs
- Disaster Psychology for CERTs

Shrimp Scampi

This is a classic Italian dish. The term scampi is an Italian word meaning breaded prawns or Langostino which is shrimp's Spanish cousin. You can substitute bite sized strips of chicken breasts. I serve my scampi on a bed of Angel hair pasta but any pasta noodles works - don't forget the crusty French bread and wine

Ingredients

- 1 lb (16 to 20 count) large raw shrimp, shelled and de-veined
- 2 TBS extra virgin olive oil
- 2 to 3 TBS butter
- Salt
- 3 to 4 cloves garlic, slivered, or 1 TBS minced garlic
- 1/4 to 1/2 tps red pepper flakes (less or more to taste)
- 1/2 cup white wine (dry white wine, Sauvignon Blanc)
- 2 TBS finely chopped parsley
- Freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 1 TBS lemon juice

Heat a sauté pan on high heat then reduce to medium high heat. Swirl the butter and olive oil into the pan. If using unsalted butter, sprinkle a little salt in the pan. Stir in the slivered garlic and red pepper flakes.

Sauté the garlic for just a minute, until it begins to brown lightly on the edges, then add the shrimp. Add the wine and stir to coat the shrimp.

Spread shrimp in an even layer in the pan. Increase the heat to high and boil the wine for about two to three minutes. If using chicken increase cooking time to four to five minutes

Remove the pan from the heat. Sprinkle the shrimp with parsley, lemon juice, and black pepper, and toss to combine. Arrange pasta on the plate add the shrimp scampi and top with parmesan cheese. Bon appétit.
