Let's start carving those pumpkins, baking pies and stacking firewood.



Pumpkin Spice and Everything Nice Gina Berry, MS, RD, CLT

Pumpkins, sweet potatoes, and acorn squash – oh my! It is the time of the year when vibrant orange tubers, roots, and squash take center stage. These guys make it easy to see why they pack such a nutritious punch – they get their color from beta carotene, a precursor to vitamin A! Vitamin A supports immune function, cell growth, and skin tissue and promotes good eye health, especially in low light. This essential nutrient is a fat-soluble vitamin and excess gets stored in the liver. As with all fat-soluble vitamins (A, D, E, & K) more is not always better! Taking excessive high dose Vitamin A supplements can cause toxicity. However, eating lots of bright orange fruit and veggies will not since your body will only convert enough beta carotene to Vitamin A as it needs.

Fun Fact: Polar Bear liver causes acute toxicity when eaten by humans due to the incredibly high amounts of stored vitamin A! So, it is best to get your vitamin A from tasty orange fruits and veggies like carrots, sweet potatoes, cantaloupe, butternut squash, mango, papaya, kabocha squash, persimmons, carnival squash, acorn squash, and pumpkin!



A Passion for Glass Michele Armanino

Most teenagers are instructed to keep their eyes on the road when learning how to drive. Tim Montesonti's dad emphatically told his sixteen-year-old son to keep his eyes off the stained-glass windows while driving around the architecturally renowned city of Chicago. Prisms of natural light streaming through saturated colors of stained glass captivated the young man.



Tim, a credentialed teacher with a passion for stained glass, eventually relocated to Redding, California where he trained in the ancient art of stained glass. Dumpsters were gold mines to Montesonti who scavenged them for pieces of broken glass to practice cutting. Eventually he opened his own art shop, Valley Stained Glass, in Napa where he and several employees instructed students in the specialized skill. "Teaching and art," says Montesonti happily, "that was the job I was made for!" Eventually affording a kiln and sandblasting equipment, he taught himself how to fuse glass, a skill not done by many artists in the 1980's. "I was always working two jobs," Tim reflected, "one to pay the bills and one to make art."

This prolific artist produces colorfully vibrant, fluid and whimsical stained-glass collections including dishes, vases, jewelry, windows and sculptures. Montesonti, whose stained-glass windows were installed at several Napa County wineries and the Travis Air Force Base, teaches art to residents at Clover Springs where there is a wait list for his classes. "I teach people how to cut and fuse glass." Montesonti explains. "Everyone is afraid at first, but they get over it."

"I find joy in every piece I create," the Cloverdale artist says thoughtfully. "It would be wonderful if everyone could find their passion and go for it." Email: timmont71@gmail.com.

Over the next year, Cloverdale Parks will add some muchneeded amenities to our parks and bring additional programs and activities. Along with establishing a new website the parks and recreation team are excited about the projects currently underway and future projects and activities. Many of these projects, are financed by either development impact fees, which are paid by developers, grant funding and/or Measure M funding approved by the voters of Sonoma County.

- The City's Parks and Recreation website www.Cloverdale. net/PARKSANDREC was officially launched in September and features information about the city park system including trails and open spaces, links to reservations & permits, volunteer opportunities, youth and sport activities, aquatics, public art as well as links to future park project and "meet the staff". Included on the website is information about the City's Adopt-A-Park and Park-A-Month Program. The website also enables residents to submit a park service request to report issues like vandalism and broken sprinklers.
- Pickleball is fast growing paddle sport that combines elements of tennis, ping pong, and badminton. We have heard from the community about the need for dedicated Pickleball courts to accommodate the growing interest in the sport. As a result, the city is currently in the process of installing two pickleball courts at Furber Park. The site was chosen with the assistance of Parks Superintendent, Hector Galvan, because its shady and conveniently located near parking. The courts will be painted a vibrant blue adding a flare of color. An opening ceremony is currently scheduled in October after the courts are completed.
- The concrete basketball courts at City Park were constructed in the 1970's and need replacement. The City Council approved a grant application to the State of California, which was awarded to construct two new full-sized courts at City park. An existing storm drain will be relocated to improve drainage in the park, and new fencing will be installed along with conduit for future lighting. The full-sized courts will be constructed of asphalt, fully striped, and ready for half or full court games. The project is expected to be complete by early 2023, weather permitting.
- Next year's Friday Night Live series in the City Plaza will have a great new amenity, a permanent restroom. The restroom will contain both men's and women's facilities and an outdoor handwashing station, doggy bowl fountain and water bottle filling faucet. The restroom facility is being constructed offsite with a scheduled delivery date in December of 2022 and will be dropped in place using a crane. Site work has begun with the removal of landscaping and the rerouting of irrigation lines. Next up is the foundation and plumbing, scheduled for October.
- The long search for a dog park may be ending. A site along Asti Road owned by the Sonoma Marin Rapid Area Transit (SMART) has been identified for a potential dog park. The City is currently collaborating with SMART on a License Agreement to utilize a portion of the SMART property next to the Cloverdale Train Depot for roughly a 1/4-acre enclosed dog park. This site will be a welcome addition to our Parks system for our four-legged friends. Stay tuned to the city website for more about the potential dog park and how to help.
- The Porterfield Creek Open Preserve is a 250-acre preserve owned by the City of Cloverdale featuring hiking trails, a spring fed creek, and incredible views of the Alexander Valley. Following the city's General Plan policies that encourage the preservation of the western hills, Staff has been diligently working to dedicate additional open space opportunities to our residents. We hope to announce additional open space opportunities soon.

El próximo año, Parques de Cloverdale añadirá amenidades necesarias a nuestro parque y programas y actividades adicionales. Junto con una nueva página web, el equipo de parques y recreación esta emocionado por los proyectos en desarrollo, lo futuros y las actividades. Muchos de ellos están financiados con las cuotas de impacto de un desarrollo, que las pagan los desarrolladores, fondos de estipendios y/o fondos de la Medida M, aprobada por los electores del Condado de Sonoma.

- La página de Parques y Recreación de la Ciudad www. Cloverdale.net/PARKSANDREC se lanzó oficialmente en septiembre y tiene información acerca del sistema de parques de la ciudad, incluyendo senderos y espacios abiertos, enlaces para reservaciones y permisos, oportunidades para voluntarios, actividades juveniles, deportivas y acuáticas, artes públicas, así como enlaces a proyectos futuros de parques y conozca al personal. También se incluye información acerca de los programas de la Ciudad Adopte un Parque y Parque del Mes. La página también permite a los residentes presentar una solicitud de servicio de parques, para reportar asuntos como vandalismo y aspersores rotos.
- Pickleball es un deporte de raqueta que se está haciendo popular rápidamente y combina elementos del tenis, ping pong y bádminton. Escuchamos a la comunidad sobre la necesidad de unas canchas de Pickleball, para atender el creciente interés en este deporte. Como resultado, la ciudad está en proceso de instalar dos canchas en el Parque Furber. El lugar se escogió con la asistencia del Superintendente de Parques, Héctor Galván, porque tiene sombra y está cerca del estacionamiento. Las canchas se pintarán en un azul vivo que añadirá un toque de color. La inauguración está programada para octubre, cuando estén terminadas.
- Las canchas de basquetbol de concreto en el Parque de la Ciudad se construyeron en los 70's y necesitan remplazo. El Consejo de la Ciudad aprobó una solicitud de estipendio del Estado de California, que fue otorgado para construir dos nuevas canchas completas en este parque. El drenaje actual se modificará para mejorar su función, se instalarán cercas nuevas con tubería para instalación de futura iluminación. Las canchas serán construidas en asfalto, con todas las líneas y listas para juegos de media cancha o completa. Se espera que se terminen a principios de 2023, si el clima lo permite.
- La serie de Viernes por la Noche en Vivo del próximo año tendrá una nueva y conveniente instalación, baños permanentes. Los baños serán separados para hombres y mujeres, con lavabos externos, un bebedero para mascotas y una llave para llenar las botellas de agua. Estos baños se están construyendo en otro lugar y su entrega está programada para diciembre 2022. Luego los pondrán en su lugar utilizando una grúa. Los trabajos en el lugar empezaron quitando la vegetación y cambiando las líneas de riego. Después vendrán los cimientos y la plomería, programados para octubre.
- La larga búsqueda de un parque para perros podría terminar. Se identificó un predio ubicado en el Asti Road, que es propiedad del Transporte Rápido del Area Sonoma Marín (SMART), para un posible parque para perros. La Ciudad está trabajando con el SMART en un Acuerdo de Licencia y poder utilizar una parte de la propiedad, que está a un lado del Depósito de Trenes de Cloverdale, para un parque para perros cerrado de cerca de ¼ de acre. Este lugar será una valiosa adición a nuestro sistema de parques, para nuestros amigos de cuatro patas. Siga atento a la página de internet de la Ciudad, para conocer más acerca del potencial parque para perros y como puede ayudar.
- La Reserva de Espacio Abierto del Porterfield Creek es un espacio de 250 acres propiedad de la Ciudad de Cloverdale que tiene senderos, un arroyo alimentado por un manantial y unas vistas increíbles del Alexander Valley. Siguiendo las políticas del Plan General de la ciudad que promueven la conservación de las colinas al oeste, el personal ha trabajado con dedicación para conseguirles oportunidades adicionales de espacios abiertos a nuestros residentes. Esperamos anunciarlas pronto.



Spooky Scams & Vicious Viruses Will Carter

As we enter the Halloween season, it is a great time to review two scary things which I regularly help my customers with: scams and viruses.

Scams: It is important, when considering the motivation of a scammer, to remember they are operating a business. Their goal is to make money, usually by tricking you into sending payment to them voluntarily - and they're very good at it! If contacted by a suspected scammer, do not allow their sincere tone or sense of urgency fool you into trusting them. Since you are unlikely to get money returned after a scam, it is crucial to avoid getting to that point!

Here is my advice for avoiding scams:

- Never call a phone number which appears alongside a warning about a virus, infection, or technical problem on your computer.
- Never engage with a phone call claiming your computer is infected, you owe the IRS money, nor any other call from a stranger offering to fix a problem you are not aware of.
- Never make payment or transfer money to a strange individual or organization.

Viruses: Like scams, the purpose of viruses is to make money for the people who create them. This is usually done in one of three ways: serving advertisements, stealing then selling your data, or extortion by holding your computer or data hostage. These illicit programs can be delivered in numerous different ways and go by many different names; luckily, they can be avoided, or their effects mitigated, by taking some precautions.

Here is my advice for protecting against viruses:

- Always keep your computer and software up to date!
 Updates include important security patches and can be more important than having an antivirus.
- Always keep an up-to-date backup of all your important information to mitigate the effects of any infection.
- Never click on any advertisements or suspicious links.

No matter the scams or viruses you may encounter, it is best to be prepared before you encounter them. If you suspect you have been the victim of a technology-based scam or your computer is infected by a virus, shut down your computer and contact a trusted computer repair specialist!

CUSD Community News Betha MacClain

As Cloverdale Unified Schools complete our first month of the school year, our staff and students are off to a great start.

The CUSD Governance Team announces that we have reached a tentative agreement with our certificated employees' union, the Teachers Association of Cloverdale (TAC), that covers both the current (22-23) and ensuing (23-24) school years. It includes a salary increase of 10% this year, an estimated total budget commitment of \$739,332 this year, and 8% next year, a further commitment of \$601,934. Combined, these raises total an additional ongoing budget commitment annually of \$1,341,266. These increases are in addition to the regular salary increases provided by advancement on their salary schedule for every full year of service, on average, an increase of 3% annually. The District and the California School Employees Association (CSEA), the union that represents our classified employees, have also reached a tentative agreement for the same salary increases provided to TAC/ teachers.

Cloverdale Unified School District has prioritized funding for student transportation. We are re-establishing our hub bus route to provide transportation to and from school for Jefferson Elementary School students. We welcome Mr. Gary Evans as our new bus driver. He will also be able to support field trips and athletics throughout the year.

Cloverdale Unified schools continue to focus on establishing school expectations and routines across our campuses and throughout our classrooms. We are in Year 2 of implementing a program called Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS). When visiting our campuses, people may see signs and hear discussion of our guiding principles: Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be Kind. PBIS looks a little different at each school since we are designing expectations and communication that is developmentally appropriate for all students. Each school has also been updating policies and handbooks to make sure that families and students have clear information to reference. Our primary goal is to create and sustain welcoming, safe, and joyful schools for every student.

Facts From The Past ~ Kay Wells

"Hey, let's go see who's at the drive-in!"

In my high school days in the late 40's that meant the Millbrae Drive-In on the San Francisco Peninsula where we checked out the after-movie scene and chowed down chocolate shakes and fries. Here in Cloverdale the place to go was and is Pick's on the Boulevard. Following is an excerpt from the History Museum's Walking Tour Guide (available at the Museum).

Reputed to be one of the oldest continuous drive-ins in the United States, Pick's Drive-In started out in the 1920's, during the early years of Prohibition, when root beer was a popular substitute for beer. Then it was known as the Reed and Bell Root Beer Stand. The Pickards, for whom Pick's is named, owned the stand from 1950 to about 1975. Long-time resident Marie Vadon Hill describes working as a carhop at Pick's in the 40's: "Although there were five stools at the counter, the majority of customers wanted service in their cars. It was fun in the summer, but it was also hard work. We were on our feet all day and sometimes the trays were heavy; balancing a try and attaching it to the car door was tricky. Our pay was 25 cents an hour and tips were usually a nickel or a dime, if any.



It was a gathering place for high school students, so we had a lot of contact with our friends."






New Pickleball Court

How to Hire a Pet Sitter
Part One: Finding a Pet Sitter



A PROFESSIONAL PET SITTER is a business owner and manager. They maintain insurance should anything go wrong while your pets and homes are under their care. They participate in continuing education and use their knowledge and experience to provide the best care. That said, there is no guarantee that a given business or sitter will be the right fit for you.

APP-BASED SITTERS offering services on platforms like Rover are wild cards. Some are great, others not so much. Since literally anyone can advertise services through these apps, there is an equal chance of finding someone good as someone incompetent.

FRIENDS, FAMILY, AND NEIGHBORS may provide pet care free of charge or on a reciprocal basis. These arrangements can be successful, as you probably know each other well. However, when something is free, you may get what you pay for. Every year I get calls from new clients in a panic, saying that their friend or relative is "too busy" to provide care for them this time. I don't blame the person for tiring of providing pet sitting for free, especially if the job involves a lot of work or a big time commitment.





Airlines and airports are launching new technology that promises to ease the tension of waiting in snaking lines at the TSA checkpoint. The solution is Reserve by Clear. The program allows travelers to reserve a dedicated time to pass through a fast lane at the security checkpoint. To reserve their free spot, passengers simply go to Reserve by Clear's site (https://www.clearme.com/reserve) to choose their airport and enter their flight details. Then, they choose a time to go through security that works with their schedule. Users will receive a confirmation email with a QR code. At the airport, travelers use the "Reserve" lane at the appointed time; security staff will scan the QR code and whisk them through the TSA line.

Reservations, based on availability, can be made up to 72 hours before departure. Reservation times will vary, but time slots are always at least 60 minutes before a domestic flight's departure time and at least 75 minutes before an international flight. (The program is not available to TSA PreCheck or Clear Plus members.)

Reserve lanes are at the following airports:

- John F. Kennedy Intl. Airport, Terminal 4
- Los Angeles Intl. Airport, Terminals 7 and 8 (called LAX Fast Lane)
- Orlando Intl. Airport, East and West Checkpoints
- Newark Liberty Intl. Airport, Terminal A and B (called EWR Virtual Line)
- Seattle-Tacoma Intl. Airport, Checkpoint 3 and 5 (called SEA Spot Saver)
- Phoenix Sky-Harbor Intl. Airport, Terminal 3 and 4 operates from 4 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Calgary Intl. Airport, Security D and E (called YYC Express)



Backpacks work great for storing these items (except food and water) and are quick to grab.

EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT CHECKLIST:

- Three-day supply of non-perishable food and three gallons of
- Map marked with at least two evacuation routes
- Prescriptions or special medications
- Change of clothing
- Extra eyeglasses or contact lenses
- An extra set of car keys, credit cards, cash or traveler's checks
- First aid kit Flashlight Battery-powered radio and extra
- Sanitation supplies
- Copies of important documents (birth certificates, passports, etc.)
- Don't forget food and water for you and your pet!

ITEMS TO TAKE IF TIME ALLOWS:

- Easily carried valuables
- · Family photos and other irreplaceable items
- Personal computer information on hard drives and disks
- · Chargers for cell phones, laptops, etc.

READY • SET • GO! REMEMBER THE SIX P'S

KEEP THESE SIX "P's" READY IN CASE IMMEDIATE EVACUATION IS REQUIRED:

- Papers, phone numbers, & important documents
- Prescriptions, vitamins, and eyeglasses
- Pictures and irreplaceable memorabilia
- Personal computer hard drive and disks
- Plastic (credit cards, ATM cards) and cash

3 & 4 PRE-EVACUATION PREPARATION STEPS

When an evacuation is anticipated, follow these checklists (if time allows) to give your home the best chance of surviving a wildfire:

OUTSIDE THE HOUSE

- Gather up flammable items from the exterior of the house and bring them inside (patio furniture children's toys, door mats, trash cans, etc.) or place them in your pool.
- 2 Turn off propane tanks.
- Move propane BBQ appliances away from structures.
- Connect garden hoses to outside water valves or spigots for use by firefighters. Fill water buckets and place them around the house.

- Don't leave sprinklers on or water running; they can affect critical water pressure
- Leave exterior lights on so your home is visible to firefighters in the smoke or darkness of night.
- Put your Emergency Supply Kit in your vehicle.
- Back your car into the driveway with vehicle loaded and all doors and windows closed. Carry your car keys with you
- Have a ladder available and place it at the corner of the house for firefighters to quickly access your roof.
- 10 Seal attic and ground vents with pre-cut plywood or commercial seals.
- 11 Monitor your property and the fire situation. Don't wait for an evacuation order if you feel threatened and need to
- 12 Check on neighbors and make sure they are preparing to leave

- 13 Shut all windows and doors, leaving them unlocked.
- 14 Remove flammable window shades and curtains. Close metal shutters.
- 15 Move flammable furniture to the center of the room, away from windows and doors.
- 16 Shut off gas at the meter. Turn off pilot lights.
- 17 Leave your lights on so firefighters can see your house under smoky conditions.
- 18 Shut off the air conditioning
- 19 Locate your pets and keep them nearby.
- 20 Prepare farm animals for transport and think about moving them to a safe location early.







Easy Beef Oven Short Ribs

I enjoy cooking beef short ribs submerged in BBQ sauce in a cast iron pot. These come out so craze tender & match well with mashed potatoes or rice.

- 5 LBS meaty bone on beef ribs
- Two carrots peeled & cut into large chunks
- One onion peeled & quartered
- Five or more peeled garlic cloves
- One 16-ounce bottle of BBQ sauce (your choice)
- One cup or more of beef stock or water

Let's cook

Salt & pepper the ribs & brown in a liberal amount of olive oil. Remove and set aside

Add the veggies & cook on medium heat until they start to become limp

Add the ribs back in with the juices. Add the bottle BBQ sauce & mix well to coat the ribs. Add the stock or water until the liquid shows around the ribs.

Place in the oven with a tight lid at 225 degrees for two hours. Check the liquid level & add as needed. Cook additional hour or until the meat is fork tender. Serve with generous amounts of sauce.

Can we all take a moment and agree in a collective halleluyah that Fall has finally arrived? I think we can all agree that when the late summer heat wave hit last month, those with air conditioning were beyond grateful and those without deserve some sort of prize for surviving.

I think perhaps it is also that after the last two years of which many of us are still reeling that my inner child who loves Christmas has been rearing her head again desperately wanting attention; sorry little one...you must wait a bit longer. First, we must take the time to enjoy the blessed arrival of Fall!

October is classically the month my mom starts arriving home from her morning pup walk with handfuls of leaves to decorate and pay homage to her favorite season. This year I felt the tug towards that as well, but my practical side has always resisted due to their short life once picked. Googling about I ran across an article on how to make waxed Fall leaves, oh my!



What does one need to make this happen you ask? Leaves, paraffin wax and a crock pot (or warmer of some type). Could it be that simple? Yes. Paraffin wax or bee's wax melted (not boiling) is perfect for dredging leaves through (once or twice) to preserve both color and form for several weeks! I will give a

recommendation here as well that using clothespins to suspend leaves whilst drying helps to keep wax from settling into natural curves and looking clumpy. The soft texture once leaves dry is divine and as long as kept out of the sun to prevent the wax from remelting, will keep the vibrant colors of Fall alive until my inner child wins out and the explosion of Christmas takes over...

Ways to Get Involved Protecting Our Creeks

- Join a hosted clean up event. For a list of events, visit www. rrwatershed.org.
- Pick up litter and trash near your home, neighborhood, or local creek. Trash and litter in the environment can end up in our waterways either directly or through the storm drain system. When it rains, trash can enter the storm drain system, which moves water from paved areas to local waterways. By picking up trash you can help prevent trash from ending up in our local creeks, the Russian River and the ocean. Even if you don't live near the Russian River or the coast, your efforts will make a difference in protecting our water resource.
- Attend an educational creek week webinar (Check rwatershed.org/blog regularly for updates).

- Discontinue pesticide and herbicide use in your garden with safer alternatives. Learn more here rrwatershed.org/project/ our-water-our-world
- Dispose of unwanted household hazardous waste (HHW) at your local HHW Collection Events https://zerowastesonoma. gov/recycle-dispose/residents/hhw-events
- Pick up pet waste
- Pick up leaf litter and yard waste to prevent it from clogging the storm drain
- When washing your car, don't allow wash water to enter the storm drain
