





On the Wild Side ~ Jennifer Molidor

Wild turkeys are living their best lives in the hills surrounding Cloverdale. On the Porterfield Creek Preserve trails behind the Del Web neighborhood, or out along River Road, you might see wild turkeys foraging. Sometimes they come down for a visit on the edges of town.

Farther from home, you can see wild turkeys at the Sacramento Wildlife Refuge. Millions of migratory birds touch down in 70,000 acres of wetland and grassland habitats. In the winter, you might see the northern shoveler, green-winged teal, and countless ducks and geese there too.

As omnivores, they eat seeds, berries, roots, insects and even lizards and frogs. When winter arrives, food is harder to find and birds move on in large flocks. And wild turkeys are fast. They can outrun chickens and clock over 12 mph. In the air, they are faster still, at up to 60mph. Still, they roost in trees overnight to avoid predators.

While it sounds like something from a Dr. Seuss book, wild turkeys have "wattles" and "snoods" (flesh that hangs from their beak and under their chin). They also have beards. They are known to gobble, but they communicate through yelps and cackles too.

The classic image of a turkey with a big fan of feathers behind is a male turkey, called a "Tom." Toms fan out feathers to attract attention from hens (female turkeys). Their displaying around other male turkeys is an attempt to establish dominance. But some hens strut too. Maybe turkeys aren't quite so different from us after all.

Turkey tails (the feathers, not the mushrooms in the forest) are plentiful. An adult is cloaked with more than 5,000 feathers on their body. Turkey feathers are seen by some cultures as a symbol of abundance. Wishing everyone abundance and gratitude this holiday season.

How to Stay Engaged: **An Antidote to Loneliness** Nora Archambeau, M.A.

As the fall months soon turn into winter months, there are certainly a lot of events to look forward to in our area, e.g., Harvest Festivals, Halloween costume parties, CPAC performances, Cloverdale's Winter Festival. Activities conjure up feelings of joy, excitement, and community. Amid all this, however, can surface feelings of loneliness, whether they be moments, days or longer stretches. In a January 2024 online article, the American Psychiatric Association (APA) conducted a 2,200-person poll identifying the subject of loneliness as a public health epidemic. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and a consulting agency gathered stats on the origins of loneliness and offered several possible antidotes to help mitigate this crisis. When 1 in 3 Americans experience loneliness every week, that is alarming.

Being in tune with oneself, whether it be through meditation, rhythmic breathing, or self-reflection helps to ascertain if there are parts of our lives that may feel "less than." I am psychospiritually oriented, therefore, I regularly check in with how I am feeling. Here are some questions I ask: "Why am I feeling off? Is there something bothering me? What is below the surface? What can I do to feel better?" Perhaps these types of questions may prompt answers. Here is another checklist that might work:

- 1. Checking in with Oneself: Ask a few depth-probina questions that you know intuitively will get to the crux of the issue. Write down the answers to avoid elusiveness. When we name what has power over us, these harder feelings are released, which then allows for less anxiety and more creative solutions to appear.
- 2. The Next Best Action Step: After having identified the potential cause of loneliness, aim to address it with 1-3 action steps that will help lift it.
- 3. Tips for Engagement (APA listed): Take a walk, call a friend, visit a café, exercise at the local gym, volunteer in town or see a counselor. Other ideas: journal out feelings, connect with Source/Divine/Universe or even spruce up the home. When all else fails, naps reset our nervous system. Plus, they feel soothing and delicious. Solutions abound!

Downtown Cloverdale "Mystery Properties" Ron Pavelka

As we continue to explore the commercial property conundrums throughout Cloverdale and primarily the downtown core, a couple of properties continually top the list of "what is going on there?".

The Cloverdale Oaks Motel. As we look to attract guests to Cloverdale, we have very few options for hospitality. "The Oaks" as the locals call it does have a colorful history and has been an integral part of downtown Cloverdale through the 50's, 60's and 70's. Today this establishment is contracted to house various vineyard works on a full-time basis from a major vintner here in Sonoma County.

The gravel parking lot adjacent to the downtown plaza. The recent trials and tribulations of this property reads like an episode of Dallas or Dynasty from the 1980's. The property encompasses several important businesses including The Outpost, Wirt's Barber Shop, The Wishing Well Laundromat and the gravel parking lot. November Gardening Tips from Sonoma County Master Gardners Sponsored by Sanz Nursery

- Time to dig up and divide ornamental grasses and perennials. Set plants in a shaded area and cover roots with damp newspaper while you are working.
- Add composted organic material and/or manure to your soil. Adding 2-4 in. of either is best. Your soil will be much improved by spring.
- Rake up leaves as they fall. Shred large leaves before composting or run a lawn mower over them. You can put them out for recycling as well, but it's best to put their nutrients back into your own garden.
- Heavy feeders such as roses and fruit trees should get a good dose of organic fertilizer.
- The first frost often occurs in the county in mid-November.
 Protect tender plants such as Bougainvillea, Hibiscus,
 Citrus, Tibouchina, and other tender species. You can use
 an anti-desiccant spray such as Cloud Cover or a spun
 fabric row cover. Covering plants with sheets or lightweight
 blankets or burlap is another option. If you use plastic
 sheeting, do not allow plastic to contact foliage.
- Spring-flowering bulbs are on display in nurseries and garden centers and good selections are available from specialty catalogues. When the ground becomes soft from rain, put bulbs in the ground as soon as you can, following package directions.
- There are many annuals that provide winter bloom, such as Icelandic poppies, pansies or other Viola, Calendula, Cyclamen, and primroses.
- Hardwood cuttings can be taken at any time during dormancy, but just after leaves have fallen is an excellent time. You can bury the cuttings in moist sand or peat moss, put them in a sheltered area, and plant next spring.

City Manager Update: Exciting Progress in Parks, Development, and Utility Innovations

City Manager David Kelley

I am pleased to provide an update on several key initiatives in Cloverdale that reflect our city's growth, commitment to recreation, and efforts to enhance public services. This fall, Cloverdale is making strides in three areas: the development of new recreation programs in our parks, updates on residential and community-focused projects, and the rollout of cutting-edge water management technology through Neptune My360.

Parks and Recreation Programming: New Opportunities for Fun, Fitness, and Conservation

Cloverdale's parks are evolving to meet the needs of our community by offering new recreational opportunities and advancing conservation efforts. In addition to exciting new activities, such as pickleball and archery, significant progress is being made on the Porterfield Creek Preserve Open Space Vegetation Management Program.

- Pickleball Program: We are excited to announce that Cloverdale's first-ever recreation courses are now underway! Registration for Pickleball opened on October 1st, and the first course, Intermediate Pickleball, began on Tuesday, October 8th. This marks the launch of our pilot program, and staff is optimistic that it will be a great success.
- Archery Program: We are launching introductory archery lessons and open-range sessions, bringing a fun, accessible activity to the community. Archery promotes focus and coordination, and we are excited to partner with local instructors to offer these classes.
- With the introduction of this recreation program, we anticipate offering more courses in the near future, expanding opportunities for community members to stay active and engaged. Porterfield Creek Preserve Open Space Vegetation Management Program Update

The Porterfield Creek Open Preserve is an extraordinary 250-acre preserve owned by the City of Cloverdale. It offers scenic hiking trails, a spring-fed creek, and breathtaking views of the Alexander Valley. The City is committed to managing this valuable resource carefully to balance recreation with ecological health and fire prevention. The City is also in the process of finalizing funding for the planning & trail improvement work on the new Soda Springs Ranch Open Space Preserve Property. Once the funding agreement is approved by Sonoma County Board of Supervisors, the City will initiate outreach efforts with the community.

The Northern Sonoma County Fuels Crew continues to make progress reducing ladder fuels and fire-prone vegetation throughout the Porterfield Creek preserve. Their efforts focus on removing dense underbrush and dead trees, which create a wildfire risk. The team's goal is to chip the majority of the removed vegetation. However, due to the preserve's steep terrain, some areas are not accessible for dragging debris to the chipper.

To address these areas, the City is continuing utilizing vegetation reduction and controlled burning in collaboration with the Northern Sonoma County Fuels Crew. Controlled pile burns will safely manage vegetation that is difficult to remove mechanically. As a precaution, certain sections of the preserve will be temporarily closed to the public during burning operations to ensure safety.

Reducing excess vegetation serves multiple purposes. Not only does it create defensible space around nearby residential areas, making it easier for firefighters to protect homes, but it also promotes a healthier ecosystem. By reducing invasive species and allowing more sunlight to reach the forest floor, native plants can thrive, supporting biodiversity and creating a habitat for a variety of wildlife.

These efforts reflect our commitment to fire prevention and environmental stewardship, ensuring that the Porterfield Creek Preserve remains a safe, vibrant space for the community to enjoy.

Development Updates: Projects Shaping Cloverdale's Future

Several development projects are currently underway, contributing to the city's growth and enhancing housing options for residents. Here's an overview of three key projects:

- Asti Road Apartment Project: This project located on Asti Road will provide 75 affordable housing units. Construction is moving forward, and is expected to be completed in 2025. The City obtained a HUD Grant to construct new sidewalks and improve accessibility along First Street between Asti Road and Main Street. The City Council approved a contract to start the design work for the sidewalk improvements.
- Taylor Lynn Phase II Apartment Project: Located on South Cloverdale Boulevard, this second phase of the project will add 24 new units to the Taylor Lynn Phase 1 project, helping address the demand for quality rental housing. This project, currently under construction, is ideal for families, professionals, and individuals seeking modern apartment living.
- Bi'du Khaale Tribal Elder Project: Located in south Cloverdale, the Bi'du Khaale project exemplifies our collaboration with the Dry Creek Rancheria of Pomo Indians, providing housing for tribal elders. The Tribal Elder Housing project aims to foster well-being by creating a culturally supportive environment for elder residents, strengthening our partnership with the Tribal community. The project is in the final phase of construction and in the near future, the Tribe will complete paving of Kelly Road.

These development initiatives represent Cloverdale's commitment to sustainable growth, housing diversity, and community collaboration.

Neptune My360 Software: Empowering Water Utility Customers

We are excited to announce that the City is preparing for the rollout of the Neptune My360 software platform, which provides utility customers with enhanced access to their water usage data. This innovative tool is part of the City's commitment to improving water management and encouraging conservation.

With My360, residents can:

- Monitor water usage in real time: Track daily consumption through an easy-to-use dashboard.
- **Set alerts for unusual activity:** Receive notifications for potential leaks or excessive water use, helping prevent waste and unexpected high bills.
- **Review historical usage:** Compare current consumption with previous months or years to identify trends and conservation opportunities.

This platform aligns with our broader smart water meter initiative, allowing residents to make informed decisions about water use. By empowering customers with data, we aim to foster a more sustainable approach to water management.

The Neptune My360 system represents Cloverdale's ongoing effort to modernize city services and promote responsible water use. We encourage residents to explore the My360 portal and take full advantage of its features, especially during the dry season. More announcements will be forthcoming on next steps for utility customers to access the online portal system.

These updates reflect Cloverdale's focus on building a vibrant, resilient community. Through expanded recreation programs, innovative development projects, and advanced water management tools, the City is working to meet the evolving needs of our residents.



Creative Corner Christy Anne


Although I have such a love of color, I often imagine my blood flows through me as rainbow, and I do mean a literal rainbow, sometimes the soul needs something a bit more...quiet. Especially with the assault of the holiday colors, whether it be the changing of the leaves or line-up of holidays – each having its own glaring palette – I find a steady pleasure falls over my soul when I see concrete. Yes, that thing we walk upon, drive over and despite it literally enabling us to get where we need to be with ease, an often underappreciated medium to create with.

Enter stage left, or stage right (as I know nothing about theater) the simple bag of Quikrete Fast Set Repair Mortar, found at our local ACE. This lightweight bag of mortar requires a mere 10 ounces of water to become a medium that even those of us without great upper body strength can handle. I offer an example of what can be created...



Needed? One bag of repair mortar, some gloves to protect your skin, a bottle of your liking and a larger vessel the bottle can be placed inside to use as a mold. Also handy here is cooking spray and whatever you need to protect the surface you will be working on. A mask also comes in handy as breathing in unmixed cement is quite dangerous. I grabbed a couple pieces of metal flashing and taped together a mold, sprayed the inside with the

cooking oil and followed the direction on the bag. After the three minutes of mixing, I then poured into mold, inserted the bottle I wished to frame in concrete, and then as a touch of whimsy, I pushed some fun felt balls I had down the edges into the concrete at varying levels. Forty minutes later I removed the mold and left to finish curing. Voila! The bringing together of unlikely friends, glass and concrete. Simple on its own, a statement with a pop of color added. A literal grounding tether, before the gust of holidays descend.





City Council Report ~ Eleanore Webster

At the September 25th meeting, a proclamation was read declaring September 15th to October 15th as Latino Heritage Month. Several members of the Cloverdale Parks Division were present to accept the recognition. Council members thanked them for their work and their contribution to the City.

The Consent Calendar was approved. It covered, in part, funding agreements with Ferguson Waterworks and Sonoma County Transportation.

Council then received a request on an update of the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance (IHO). This request reviews how in-lieu fees are calculated when contractors choose to pay a fee rather than provide low-income housing. An IHO is an ordinance in the zoning code that impacts affordable housing: developers can pay a fee or create new units. They are supposed to set aside 15% of the units as affordable. \$25,000 has been budgeted to study policy updates and Staff is asking the Council to approve moving forward with consideration on how to update the Ordinance. The IHO applies to projects with five or more housing units. Several Council members expressed a preference for building requirements over the fee option, since the contractors are in

the business of building housing and can do a more efficient job than the City.

Council also passed a resolution regarding the FAA Airport Improvement Program Grant Funding Agreement. This involves the lights on the runway. Council accepted the funding and the design. This is another step in an existing improvement project. The grant covers 90% of the cost. Council commented on the importance of the airport to the community, especially in emergency situations.

The Council adopted a resolution on an MOU with the Cloverdale Police Officer's Association and authorized the City Manager to execute the MOU.

Letters of interest were submitted to the Sonoma County Mayors' and Councilmembers' Association for Measure O, Citizens Oversight Committee Appointments. The Association has two open seats, and they received letters of interest from four people. Council was asked to provide direction to the Mayor and they made recommendations on the nominees. Letters are attached to the agenda, which can be found at https://www.cloverdale.net/agendacenter. The October 9th meeting was cancelled.









Goodbye Windows 10 Will Carter

In September of 2022, I wrote my first article for the Cloverdale Connect titled "What is Windows 11?" In this article I touched on the future of Windows 10, which is still the most popular desktop operating system in the world today. However, Windows 10 isn't forever, and Microsoft will be ending all support for Windows 10 on October 14th, 2025. Anyone still using Windows 10 should be looking at upgrading before that date. If you're still using Windows 10, read on to learn your options!

In the best-case scenario, you might have already been prompted to upgrade to Windows 11. If you've seen an offer to upgrade through Windows Update, go ahead and accept it! Windows 11 is a stable and reliable operating system, which is very easy to learn if you're accustomed to 10. This upgrade may take as much as a few hours, during which your system will restart, prompt you to make some choices, then drop you into a brand-new version of Windows!

Sometimes Windows Update won't immediately offer you Windows 11 but will ask to check if your system is compatible. If you get a prompt like this, you can use Microsoft's PC Health Check app to find out if your system is eligible for an upgrade. Most systems with an Intel 8th generation or newer processor should be compatible with Windows 11, so if your system is less than seven years old, chances are it will work!

Under many circumstances, a computer might be capable of running Windows 11, but a configuration or settings issue will prevent the upgrade from going through. If you bought your system since 2017, an expert could easily let you know if your system is compatible with the latest version of Windows. Whether your current system is ready for Windows 11, you need to buy a new PC, or you're uncertain, consider reaching out to a trusted technology provider to get any questions you have answered!

Cloverdale's Honorary Firehouse Mom ~ Mary Jo Winter

Born March 15, 1894, in San Francisco, Nellie (Pinkerton) Lechler met and married a construction worker by the name of Charlie Lechler in 1929. They moved to Cloverdale in 1950 to run the Preston Store.

After Charlie's death in 1967, Nellie moved into a little house at 118 Broad St., right next door to the new firehouse that would open in 1972. It didn't take long for her and the firemen to come the best of friends.

Once, after being out of town for a few days, she thought she had returned to the wrong address. To her amazement, she discovered the fire crew had completely repainted the exterior of her home in her absence.

Nellie was an adopted mom to the crew she always referred to as "my boys." In 1976, she was honored by the City of Cloverdale and given the title of Honorary Fireman. Her picture was even hung on the firehouse wall.

She was a member of the Firemen's Ladies Auxiliary and a frequent visitor at the firehouse. She regularly brought over homemade cakes and cookies and consistently volunteered to sell tickets for fire department fundraisers and activities.

When Cloverdale hosted the 1986 Fireman's Muster, Nellie was the parade Grand Marshal, complete with a red hat and riding in a horse-pulled surrey. Despite her advanced age, she didn't miss a single day of the festivities. The weekend was filled with her beaming smile and constant encouragement to her "boys."

Nellie's other accolades over the years included being chosen Grand Marshal of the Citrus Fair Parade, named Rebekah Lodge's Woman of the Year, and even being named an honorary resident of Kings Valley.

When Nellie died on July 28, 1987, her fireman friends placed a small flag at half-mast amongst the flowers in her garden next door.

Cooking with David Maciel

In November we celebrate Thanksgiving. It's one of my favorite holidays - family & friends coming together to enjoy a meal. I enjoy this side dish of fresh roasted vegetables. You can be very creative with the selection.

Thanksgiving Medley of Roasted Vegetables Ingredients

- 1 lb Brussels sprouts (4 cups), trimmed and halved
- 3 large carrots (3 cups), peeled and cut into chunks
- 2 medium red onions, cut into wedges
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 tablespoon maple syrup
- 1 tablespoon fresh chopped rosemary, (or 1 teaspoon dried)
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ cup walnuts or pecans
- ½ cup dried cranberries

Instructions

Add the Brussels sprouts, carrots, red onions, olive oil, maple syrup, rosemary, salt, pepper, and cinnamon. Toss well to combine.


Spread the veggies evenly over the two prepared baking sheets. Roast for 20 - 25 minutes, stirring halfway through until the veggies are fork-tender and beginning to brown. Sprinkle over the walnuts and dried cranberries and continue to bake another 5 - 10 minutes until the veggies are cooked and the nuts are lightly roasted.

made of corten steel, which is known for its ability to age and weather due to its copper, chromium and nickel content. When left untreated, the steel quickly begins to create an organic rust patina that will not cause deep pitting as is the case with traditional milled steel. Recycled car parts are also incorporated at times when appropriate to the piece, and exposed rivets, wide lap welds and sturdy bolts add to its aesthetic, while at the same time creating balance and structure to withstand the elements.

Harris was born in Baja into an artist family and has experimented with many art mediums, but he found his true passion in 2007 when he learned to weld. His inspiration comes from the effortless shapes of perfect symmetry, as well as perfect asymmetry in nature. Harris sees his work as monuments to wild plant and animal life but says, "My sculptures are abstract, so people can read into it what they like. They can be open to new and unique inspirations that have not yet been thought of. I think that is the best thing about abstract art".
