#### City Council Report ~ Eleanore Webster

December 10 meeting: Council adopted the 2025 CA Building and Fire regulations. The meeting primarily focused on adoption of two reports for the proposed Esmeralda Project: Water Supply Assessment (a requirement for projects with more than 500 residential units) and Water Supply Verification (a requirement for residential subdivisions). The major question was whether the City's water system is sufficient during dry and normal years to incorporate Esmeralda for the next 20 years. If supplies are insufficient, then Esmeralda must find ways to acquire additional water before moving forward. The WSA/WSV analysis relied on the City's Urban Water Management plan and updated information about the Potter Valley Project (PVP).

Brad Arnold of EKI Environment and Water, the consulting firm hired by Esmeralda, made the presentation (see https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=26NMMnxftRs). Property development was approved 20 years ago; this presentation was only about water availability. The City draws water from Russian River underground water flows (not the river itself) and has some of the oldest (1884) water rights in California. Water flows collect from the watershed and are sustained primarily by natural rain fall. Seniority means the City has higher priority to draw water.

The Reports conclude there is more water available than projected future needs by about 30%. Even under conservative assumptions, projected demand remains below City's entitlements. Cloverdale more than meets California water targets and Esmeralda will not change this. Our annual water use has declined by about 30% since 2005, with infrastructure upgrades and customer water use efficiency. In dry years, the City's water usage is managed through the City's water shortage contingency plan. The 2021 curtailment that everyone remembers was driven by State mandated usage limitations, not actual water shortage. The analysis considered PVP and found that supply to be a small

percentage of accumulated water. In summary, WSA/WSV analysis indicates that Cloverdale has sufficient and reliable water supplies to accommodate Esmeralda through 2045, under both drought and normal years.

Questions/comments from the Council focused on water storage (a tank is included on Esmeralda for City as well as project use), PVP impact, potential State removal of seniority water rights (Sacramento could try to void the rights), and Cloverdale cultural interests. There is a sustainability limit on population capacity, which is about 13,000 for Cloverdale. We are now at about 8,000 and Esmeralda will probably bring us to about 9,500.


Questions/comments from the public focused on alternative use of the property (which might not be as beneficial), funding/corporate ownership theories surrounding Esmeralda, and the need for more town halls about this. There were questions about the bias of the consultants who were paid by Esmeralda, with suggestions to have a third party review of the WSA/WSV. Since a third party would have to be paid by someone, one question centered on who would be considered unbiased.

Mayor Lands stated that five different assessments have shown the water is sufficient. He also said that Cloverdale is one of the few California cities that meets the lower income housing threshold. What we are lacking is middle and higher income housing, which is a healthy provider to City income because of the higher tax base. Similar issues were raised when the Furber, Dell Web and Sonoma Family homes projects were considered. Mayor Lands supports Esmeralda, saying it would be positive for the City. The reports were accepted by Council.

New Business: After a spirited discussion about the process of selecting Mayor and Vice Mayor (the rotation method often used and Cloverdale used to use, v. merit or personal preference), Vice Mayor Brian Wheeler was selected as Mayor and Mayor Todd Lands was selected as Vice Mayor.



#### Wishing You a Secure New Year! Will Carter

In 2026 we can expect technology to continue to change, both in our lives and in the broader world. Because of those changes, sometimes we, as users, need to change a little bit too! I have three suggestions for steps you can take to ensure you're prepared for anything that may come this year.

Get your critical accounts secure. This is first because it is the most important. Scamming and data breeches continue to victimize my clients at all tech literacy levels, and throughout 2025 it only got worse. I suggest determining which of your accounts are critical (email, banking, e-commerce, messaging services, etc.) then reviewing each for security. Ensure those passwords are unique, 2 factor authentication is enabled, and that recovery information is accurate. A simple compromised email account can allow scammers to impersonate you on social media, access any unsecured online banking, completely steal your Amazon account, and leave you permanently locked out of most accounts. Don't wait to check on those critical accounts!

**Backup your data**. Even without scammers, technology is still vulnerable to the traditional concerns: Loss, theft, failure, and destruction. From dropping phones in toilets, to leaving laptops in airports, anyone can experience data loss. You should be backing up any data which you want to keep! Smartphones have cloud services for your photos, messages, and app data; computers have first- and third-party cloud providers, as well as local options. Manually copying important files to an external drive is better than nothing!

Monitor your digital world. Even under the best of circumstances, things still go wrong! I am a firm believer in turning on sign-in notifications for my online accounts and for anything financial. Turn on notifications for purchases, transactions, and sign-ins. If you don't know your accounts have been accessed, you won't know to act on that information.

The good news is that more of these settings and precautions are becoming the default with many accounts! When those little messages pop up during sign ins, take a moment to read them, understand what is being offered, and enable the most advanced security options you are comfortable with.



### **Library Seeks Community Input**


Your Library, Your Voice: Help Shape the Future of Library Services

# January Gardening Tips from Sonoma County Master Gardeners Sponsored by Sanz Nursery

- Continue to monitor weather forecasts for nighttime lows. To protect frost-tender plants use an anti-desiccant spray such as Cloud Cover or a spun fabric floating row cover when frost is actually predicted. Covering plants with sheets or lightweight blankets or burlap is another option. If you use plastic sheeting, do not allow plastic to contact foliage.
- Bareroot shrubs and trees will begin appearing in nurseries.
   Bareroot is a good way to plant many fruit trees, shrubs, and roses. If you can't plant the day of your purchase, submerge roots in a bucket of water up to 24 hours and plant as soon as you can.
- Roses should be pruned between New Year's and Valentine's Day. Be careful not to compact soil around plants with your feet when you prune. Prune hard, leaving 3-4 young, vigorous canes per plant.
- Clean, oil, and store tools such as shovels, hoes, and pruners. Use light machine oil on metal parts to prevent rust.
- Begin to cut back deciduous ornamental grasses, pruning within a couple of inches from the ground. Wait until February or March if you like the existing structure. Winds often blow dried stems away from unpruned grasses.
- Rats favor heavy cover like overgrown ivy. If you have ivy, the best time to prune or remove it is winter when growth slows and soil is somewhat soft. If you wait until spring, ivy will quickly grow back, and roots will be harder to remove.

#### Tenacity = Success Michele Armanino


When fourteen-year-old Ventura Ruiz arrived in Cloverdale from Michoacan, Mexico in 1980, he had three dreams: to own a house, a business and six trucks.

Ruiz, owner of Maggie's Dad Landscape Company, joined his dad, a vineyard worker, upon his arrival in Windsor. However, there wasn't any lodging available for the two of them, so he and his dad hit the road looking for new employment. Luckily, they crossed paths with Joe Ramazzotti, (Ramazzotti Wines) who was looking for vineyard workers. The Ramazzottis furnished the Ruizes with a small, rent-free house on their property where father and son lived and worked for the family for six years. "Joe Ramazzotti taught me how to drive on his old Ford truck, and his brother taught me how to drive a stick shift." Ventura reminisces.

Married at twenty-one, and with one year of English classes at Santa Rosa, J.C., completed, Ventura moved on in search of work to support his family. "I did janitorial work for four years, but really missed the outdoors." he says. "I found an ad in the newspaper for a gardener, so I applied for the job and got it." But when the landscaping business moved to Sacramento, Ventura quit the job. One of his customers encouraged him to create his own business. "She told me that she would tell people about me. I took her advice and within six months I had two employees!"


That same customer advised him that he needed to give his business a name and suggested he use his daughter's name, Magdalena, (Maggie) who was born in 1993. "That's how I got the name, Maggie's Dad Landscape Company." Ruiz says smiling. With a landscaping contractor's license under his belt, Ruiz's business was going strong in all of Sonoma County and parts of Marin.

In 1990, Ruiz purchased his first house. In time, he acquired six trucks and eventually bought Sanz Nursery located by Ace Hardware. He's thankful to Barnes Lumber and Ace Hardware for guiding him along his journey, along with all his loyal customers. "All my dreams came true." he says. "Well", he comments chuckling, "I have seven trucks!" And a beautiful grandson, Matteo.





As I mentioned in an earlier column, my father was a renaissance man. This is one of his many poems:





### Communicating with The City

The City of Cloverdale welcomes your communication. In the spirit of transparency and open government, here is the best way to get in touch. For everyday questions, service requests, and the general stuff that keeps a city running, the fastest path is to email: customerservice@ci.cloverdale.ca.us. The staff will make sure it lands with the right department so you aet an answer.

However, for big ideas, random thoughts, long term hopes, or any comment that helps shape our little city, you can always reach your elected officials directly. You can email the full City Council at citycouncil@ci.cloverdale.ca.us or send meeting comments to publiccomments@ci.cloverdale.ca.us

A quick note: When you write to the full Council (or a majority of them), state law treats your message as public comment. That means it becomes part of the public record and is attached to the agenda packet. Also, don't expect a group reply. They aren't ghosting you, they just legally can't respond as a group. Additionally, know the City does not usually redact email addresses or contact information from written correspondence, but if you prefer to comment anonymously, just say so and they will honor it, (add that to the title or subject so they don't miss it). Alternatively, if you would rather print or write a letter by hand, drop it off at City Hall during business hours or leave it in the metal payment box by the front door. They collect those daily and include in the record.

Swing by a meeting instead and share your thoughts during the public comment periods. Council will listen and take your input into consideration, but know these moments are not designed for back-and-forth conversation; it is a space for you to be heard. Courteous comments are encouraged so meetings stay accessible for all, while fully respecting everyone's right to share their viewpoint.

No matter your preferred method, The City welcomes participation from everyone. Whatever is on your mind, there is a place for it. Reach out, share your thoughts, and help shape the future of Cloverdale.

### Let's Work Together To Make 2026 A Great Year For Cloverdale!

Happy New Year to our Cloverdale Community! While 2025 had its disappointments and challenges, we can celebrate two successes: the passage of Proposition 50 and successfully gathering enough signatures to put the SMART Initiative on the June 2026 ballot.

Proposition 50 was approved by approximately 64.4% of voters statewide, 73.53% in Sonoma County, and 64.7% in Cloverdale. This measure is part of a broader national redistricting strategy in response to partisan gerrymandering. The California Secretary of State officially certified the election results on December 12, 2025. This success is the result of grassroots organizing by the Sonoma County Democrats and regional clubs like the Cloverdale Democratic Club.

While many of us were working to pass Proposition 50, we were also hard at work gathering the necessary signatures to put the renewal of the SMART sales tax on the June 2026 ballot. The Sonoma-Marin Area Rail Transit (SMART) system is an essential component of our region's transit infrastructure providing reliable public transportation, reducing congestion, and connecting our communities throughout the North Bay. Without raising taxes, the SMART Initiative seeks to renew SMART's public funding through a voter-led initiative, ensuring service beyond 2028, and the continued provision of safe, well-maintained, and accessible trains and pathways. SMART is currently funded through Healdsburg with expected completion in 2028. The passage of the renewal will ensure SMART can begin the planning phase of the train and pathway north to Geyserville and Cloverdale connecting residents with jobs, services, and recreation. #### Economic Development Erik Terreri

The Cloverdale Chamber of Commerce's Economic Development Committee is chaired by Erik Terreri and includes Vice Chair Steve Kawa, Executive Director Neena Hanchett, City Manager Kevin Thompson, and community members Jes Slavik, Marne Dupere, Elissa Morrash, and Board Chair Tedi Spain.

The primary mission of the Economic Development Committee is to encourage investment in Cloverdale and support the revitalization of the downtown commercial core. Cloverdale faces a challenging business environment due to its geographic location and relatively small local and regional population. For local businesses to succeed, strong support from Cloverdale residents is essential. At the same time, long-term economic vitality requires attracting visitors and investment from outside the immediate area.

Cloverdale has experienced a declining population in recent years—an issue that poses a serious risk to the long-term health of any community. Declining populations are often the death knell of a town. Importantly, Cloverdale's existing water and wastewater infrastructure was built to accommodate a projected population of approximately 12,500 people. Today, the city is roughly 4,000 residents below that planned capacity. As a result, Cloverdale can readily support additional population growth using its current infrastructure and water supplies.

New development also plays a critical role in maintaining and improving the city's aging infrastructure. Sales tax revenue, property taxes, and impact fees generated by responsible development help fund necessary repairs and upgrades without placing additional burden on existing residents. Because downtown commercial-zoned properties are limited, these sites must be developed thoughtfully—prioritizing projects that generate sales tax revenue, deliver new and appropriate commercial buildings, incorporate well-designed housing, and help reverse Cloverdale's population decline.

Over the next six months, the Economic Development Committee will be conducting a series of community surveys to better understand how Cloverdale residents shop, where they work, and how they envision the future of our town. This feedback will directly inform policy discussions and economic-development strategies moving forward.

I am excited about the future of Cloverdale and confident that, with thoughtful planning, community engagement, and strategic investment, our town can continue to thrive.






# Let's Travel ~ Craig Clark

The kettle drum rumble of thunder signaled a bowling strike by little men.



# **Cooking with David Maciel**

In January if you're like me I try to take off those holiday pounds. This gluten free pasta dish is low in calories and very satisfying. You can substitute any pasta and add cooked chicken or shrimp to mix it up.

#### Mediterranean Veggie Pasta

- 8 oz or about 2 heaping cups of your favorite gluten-free pasta
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- $\frac{1}{4}$  teaspoon crushed red pepper use  $\frac{1}{2}$   $\frac{3}{4}$  tsp if you want spicy
- 2-3 garlic cloves minced
- 2 cups grape tomatoes halved
- 1 cup vegetable broth
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 10 Kalamata olives pitted and coarsely chopped
- ½ heaping cup marinated artichokes
- 3-4 tablespoon of tomato paste to the recipe.
- 4 cups baby spinach
- 1/4 cup torn basil leaves

Optional: Parmesan, feta or ricotta, salt for serving

#### Instructions

- Bring a large saucepan of water to a boil (without salt). Add pasta; cook 8 minutes or until al dente. Reserve 1 cup pasta water then drain in a colander. Set aside.
- While pasta cooks, heat a large skillet over medium heat.
- Add oil to pan and swirl to coat. Add red pepper and garlic; sauté 30 seconds or until fragrant.
- Add tomato paste, stir over heat for about 1 minute.
- Add tomatoes, broth, salt, black pepper, artichokes and olives. Cook 5-7 minutes or until tomatoes begin to break down, stirring occasionally.
- Add pasta, and simmer 2 minutes. If needed add more liquid, reserved pasta water, hot water or more broth as desired.
- Stir in spinach and basil; cook 2 minutes or until greens wilt.
- Remove from heat and serve.
- Top with cheese if desired. Enjoy!
